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## Editorial: Electronic resources, and caring at a distance

We are very grateful for all the helpful feedback we received from the conference in Thailand in April. In this editorial, I want to respond to one of the many useful comments, which was:

'I think it would be great to have a GMCN effort to encourage more electronic versions of member care resources. Many missionaries are becoming more and more mobile, working in restricted access countries, more member care work is being done from a distance and requires more travel to various field locations. Electronic books will become increasingly vital in caring well in these areas and circumstances'.

Please tell us about any electronic resources which you recommend – including any you have produced. We can list these in the next newsletter.

Concerning the comment that 'more member care work is being done from a distance', those who attended the conference had an opportunity to attend two workshops related to this. One was about building partnerships with member care providers in other locations. In the second, Brent Lindquist warned licensed therapists that they need to check that they are licensed to practice in the places where they are offering services. For those who are allowed (and insured) to offer services by Skype or telephone to a distant location, do you have any 'dos and don'ts' of good practice? Or any resources you would recommend?
