## Editorial: NEW WINESKINS

During the closing session of the Global Member Care Network Conference in April in Chiang Mai, Harry Hoffmann challenged us to think new about Member Care according to Luke 5:37-38 (NIV): *“And no one pours new wine into old wineskins. If he does, the new wine will burst the skins, the wine will run out and the wineskins will be ruined. No, new wine must be poured into new wineskins.”*

**Working in Africa** as Member Care Consultant, I often ask myself how these new wineskins should look like, not only in Africa, but in all “new” Member Care contexts. To answer this question, we should first look at another question: what have we heard and learnt from the people we serve and care for? Are we caring for them with old wineskins that no longer fit or do we have the insight, adaptability and flexibility to form and mould new wineskins based on what the *real* needs are?

In all of this I am excited, **because I already see glimpses of the new wineskins** where ...

...Member Care providers embrace a broader definition of those being cared for, because in their context it might include pastors working hand in hand with missionaries within a dominantly unreached group, a convert going back into a remote area to reach out to his/her own people group or members of a local church or community whom the missionary belongs to.

...Member Care providers embrace the sending church and equip and encourage them to care for their missionaries, form partnerships with organisations and in that way moulding new wineskins for senders.

...Member Care providers embrace a new way of looking at support raising and realize that within their context support raising might go hand in hand with equipping people in income generating activities.

Do we put the old wineskins just aside and start all over again? Surely not! So many great Member Care providers have carved out the way in the past; so many great Member Care models have been developed. Our challenge is to integrate the old with the new.

Where do old and new wineskins then meet each other? At the same place where it all started...at the feet of our Lord. To again learn from Jesus how to kneel down and wash the feet of those we care for, listen to their hearts and serve them in humility and with integrity.

To enhance the level of knowledge and skill proficiency for those involved in counseling in the mission context: member care or development staff, as well as those who work with crisis, trauma, debriefing, and grief work. The seminar will be open to all mission sending agencies.

Except for the English fluency criterion, exceptions will be considered on an individual basis.

The Global Member Care Network (GMCN) recognises that many member care practitioners around the world are working not only with mission partners but also with local people in direct counselling and training/capacity building in local/national churches.

Contexts include:

Catastrophes, Crisis counselling , Historic national trauma , Responding to church requests for People Helper training , Supervision/consulting with local caregivers working in churches and local ministries such as orphanages, street children and anti-trafficking

This think-tank brings together people who want to see counselling, psychology and psychiatry as well as psychosocial approaches expanded and developed as a vital part of mission strategy worldwide. It will explore the vision, strategies, goals and motivation. It will look at ways to empower the church in majority world situations to provide local care to meet people's emotional needs.
